October 10, 2014 Discussion Notes Approved

Discussion Highlights:

1. UC Long-Term Stability Plan for Tuition and Financial Aid

- a. At the November Regents meeting, the UC Regents will consider implementing a UC Long-Term Stability Plan for Tuition and Financial Aid.
 - i. The plan proposes that UC tuition will not increase more than 5 percent annually for five years. That means in-state tuition will rise by no more than \$612 in 2015-16
 - ii. Adoption of this new model also will ensure that the university can maintain its current financial aid program under which more than half of all California undergraduates have their tuition and student services fees fully covered.
- b. The state continues to reduce funding to the UC system despite a surplus in the budget.
- c. Students are upset and mobilizing to campaign and voice their concerns and frustration.

2. Campus Climate Survey Response

- a. There was a meeting last week at UCI to discuss the system-wide response to the Climate Survey.
 - i. During the meeting, constituencies from the various campuses discussed the issues and concerns the data raised and to set priorities.
 1. 24% of respondents said they witnessed or experienced exclusive behavior.
 - a. 8% of those said it impacted their ability to do their job or learn.
 - ii. UC Provost Dorr set a timeline for mid-December for campuses to set goals.

1. One goal must be related directly to campus from campus data.
2. One goal must be integrated into the Diversity and Inclusion initiatives.
3. A UCD committee is scheduled to bring the report to Chancellor Katehi by the end of January 2015.
