**March 24, 2014 Discussion Notes Approved**

**Discussion Highlights:**

**1. Picnic Day Planning**

- a. This year marks the 100<sup>th</sup> Picnic Day.
- b. Event Schedule can be found online at <http://picnicday.ucdavis.edu/> and hardcopies will be available around campus.
- c. Changes for this year's Picnic Day include:
  - i. A "See Something, Say Something" campaign is being promoted to encourage people to report incidents they see throughout the day.
  - ii. The EOC (Emergency Operations Center) will be open throughout the day.
  - iii. A large number of Student Affairs staff will be dispersed throughout Picnic Day as another resource, should community members need assistance.
- d. Police Department Preparations include:
  - i. Promotion of the Zero Tolerance campaign
    1. Violations on campus will be eligible for the Neighborhood Court Program.
  - ii. Additional officers have been brought in to assist in patrolling Picnic Day. An estimate of 63 officers will be on duty (bike, walking, golf carts).
  - iii. UC Davis is committed to providing officers to the City of Davis after 4pm to help with patrolling the city throughout the remainder of the day and into the night.

## **2. WASC (Western Association of Schools and Colleges) Visit Update**

- a. The WASC Onsite Accreditation Visit was held April 9-11, 2014 on campus.
  - i. The purpose of the onsite visit is for the WASC review team to meet with campus constituencies regarding areas of interest related to evaluating our effectiveness as an institution, including advising, planning and budget strategies, and student services.
- b. The overall response to the visit was very positive.
  - ii. The Chair was reported to state that this was the longest list of commendations he had seen and that the recommendations were already being implemented.
- c. The final Accreditation outcome will come out in mid-June after the commission meets.

## **3. Fix50**

- a. Fix50 is a Caltrans project that will rehabilitate a section of U.S. Highway 50, known as the W/X Viaduct.
- b. Information can be accessed from the Fix50 website: <http://fix50.com/>
- c. The following project timeline outlines the current plans:
  - i. NOTE: Each phase of the project, described below, will be worked on 24 hours per day, 7 days a week.
  - ii. Eastbound Highway 50: April 22 – May 21
    1. At least 3 lanes will be open
    2. Connector ramp from eastbound Highway 50 to southbound Highway 99 will be closed
    3. Connector ramp from eastbound Highway 50 to eastbound Business 80 will be closed
    4. Westbound traffic will be fully open as normal with no impact
  - iii. Westbound Highway 50: May 27 – June 25
    1. At least 3 lanes will be open
    2. Connector ramp from westbound Business 80 to westbound Highway 50 will be closed
    3. Eastbound traffic will be fully open as normal with no impact

## **4. Additional Topics for Discussion:**

- a. Diversity Dialogues
  - i. Dialogue coordinators are still requesting more faculty participation in the Dialogue discussions.
  - ii. Suggestions for inviting faculty:
    1. Personally invite faculty members by stopping by offices hours or meeting with them in-person.
    2. Identify faculty that connects with the specific dialogue topics and reach out directly to those faculty members.
    3. Connect with the Grad group Chairs and the Grad Council.
- b. Solano/Orchard Park
  - i. Discussions have been placed on “pause” and will resume in the fall.
- c. Suggestion: More leadership positions for students.
  - i. It was suggested that more student leadership roles be created to increase student engagement with the administration.
