

We are honored to welcome **Martha C. Nussbaum**, one of the nation's most accomplished and influential philosophers, as speaker at this special event cosponsored the Chancellor's Colloquium Distinguished Speaker Series and the UC Davis Forums on the Public University and the Social Good.

Professor Nussbaum, who was profiled in a recent issue of the New Yorker magazine, is the Ernst Freund Distinguished Service Professor of Law and Ethics in the Law School and Philosophy Department at the University of Chicago. She is also an associate in the Classics Department, the Divinity School, and the Political Science Department.

Among her scholarly works are *Political Emotions: Why Love Matters for Justice* (2013) and *Anger and Forgiveness: Resentment, Generosity, Justice* (2016). She has also edited 21 books.

Professor Nussbaum received her BA degree from New York University and her MA and PhD from Harvard University. She has taught at Harvard, Brown University, and Oxford University. From 1986 to 1993, she also served as a research advisor at the World Institute for Development Economics Research, Helsinki.

A recipient of this year's prestigious Kyoto Prize in Arts and Philosophy, Professor Nussbaum has received honorary degrees from 56 colleges and universities around the world.
